You "have been borne by me from before your birth, carried from the womb; even to your old age I am he, and to gray hairs I will carry you. I have made, and I will bear; I will carry and will save" (Isaiah 46:3b-4 ESV).

The LORD be with you! Thank you for your Gospelmotivated voices in 2019. Thank you especially for your support, encouragement, and fellowship as Lutherans For Life. In 2019, you helped us reach many with courage and compassion, and God employed it all in changing hearts and saving lives. We motivated, educated, and activated hundreds from coast to coast at our six regional conferences. We engaged thousands with our displays and presentations at church-body conventions, educator convocations, and youth gatherings. We delivered dozens of Life Sunday sermons, led scores of Bible studies and school chapel services, hosted classroom presentations, and held community workshops. We launched web pages dedicated to information about vaccines involving aborted fetal tissue and reflections on the film Unplanned. We welcomed a new Y4Life Director and a new Mission and Ministry Director. We established new Life Chapters and new Life Teams. We received grant funding from LWML (\$30,000!) for developing and distributing digital content (podcasts, webinars, videos, graphics, social media posts). We did it with responsible and accountable stewardship, beating our budget-thanks to the grace of God and the generosity of thousands like you! And we have much more underway for 2020 (website redesign, new bulletin inserts, booklets and brochures, publicity campaign for Word of Hope, Life Sunday congregational resources, and quarterly journal *LifeDate*)!

2019 LFL Regional Conferences

For our 2019 regional conferences, we found ourselves all across the country engaging with many LFL friends and finding many new ones. There are so many people who support life, and it is a joy to be able to come to your neighborhoods and share encouragement and information in order to assist you in your life-affirming work. Lives are being touched every day when people share the For Life message of God's love for life. We want to especially thank the members and staff at Living Word Lutheran Church, Grapevine, Texas; Concordia University, Ann Arbor, Michigan; Hope Lutheran Church, Aurora, Colorado; Trinity Lutheran Church, Rochester, Minnesota; Trinity Lutheran Church, Joppa, Maryland; and West Portal Lutheran Church, San Francisco, California, who opened their doors and hearts for our regional conferences. What a joy it was to work with the members of these congregations and our local Life Chapters and Life Teams. The Lord blessed the efforts

of these faithful stewards For Life, and we at LFL are so very appreciative as without them these conferences would not be possible.



Life Teams/Life Chapters/Mission and Ministry

Praise be to God for our wonderful volunteers! Because of you, we can assuredly say that 2019 proved to be another life-affirming, Christ-centered year at Lutherans For Life. Our Life Teams and Life Chapters continued to

proclaim the worth that every person has on account of what Christ did for them on the cross, and Lutherans throughout the country continued to show mercy to "the least of these" through their faithful, Gospelmotivated service. We can rejoice that seven new Life Teams were formed in Indiana, Michigan, Missouri, and New York, and two Life Chapters were formed in Kansas. Also, 50 Life Team Tool Kits were sold in 23 different states which will undoubtedly lead to more Frontline groups forming in 2020. Thank you for your continued commitment to our organization by sharing Christ in the life arena!

New resources offered in 2019: From Age to Age the Same Life Sunday materials (bulletin insert, Just For Kids insert, sermons, and service); the brochures Jesus Loves Me and those with Down syndrome and A look at what Lutherans For Life is all about (an in-house promotional brochure); and new bulletin inserts: Ascension Means His Grace Goes Everywhere (for Ascension Day) and Redeemed (for Christmas).

Word of Hope



In 2018, Word of Hope received \$59,586.58 in LWML District biennium grants along with \$15,000.00 in grants from the Roy and Ingaborg Memorial Endowment Foundation and the Rupert Dunklau Foun-

dation, which permitted Chrissie to promote **Word of Hope** at conferences, conventions, church rallies, and Bible studies throughout 2019. This financial support funded the development and mailing of 271 **Word of Hope** info packets to Life Teams and Life Chapters, LWML Districts, District Life Coordinators, LFL Federation Presidents, and selected **Word of Hope** donors.

The increased promotion through presentations, exhibits, and mailings significantly impacted the number and types of contacts to **Word of Hope**. In 2018, Chrissie started out receiving approximately three (3) calls a month. As a result of direct promotion, the average rose to one (1) contact a day and those contacts began to include phone calls, emails, text messages, and video sessions. By the end of 2019 and continuing into January of 2020, **Word of Hope** contacts escalated to an average of five (5) per day. Whenever possible, **Word of Hope** provided referral resources to callers in need. In a couple cases, however, local referrals were unavailable, and Chrissie was able to offer video or phone sessions for abortion recovery from a Lutheran perspective. In 2020, additional Word of Hope hours will be needed.


Y4Life



Y4Life had many opportunities to engage youth and prepare them to share a 4Life message in 2019! We began the year with the March for Life in Washington, D.C., where **Y4Life** partnered with the LCMS to provide youth activities during their biennial life conference. Not only did the **Y4Life** Director Laura Davis enjoy the March, but she was also able to begin celebrating the little life

growing in her own womb! Because she desired to stay at home with her child, a search began for a new **Y4Life**

Director. After many interviews and much prayer, a call was extended to Michelle Bauman, current director of **Y4Life**. In addition to preparing for and training a new director, spring activities included the annual Y4Life College Leadership Retreat. The retreat was attended by students from four Concordias, three of which were already active in life ministries. A busy spring was followed by a whirlwind summer! Full of speaking engagements, exhibits, and many opportunities to interact with youth and supporters of LFL, Y4Life was present at FLY, NYG, Higher Things, and the National LWML Convention. At the LWML Convention, we were able to give thanks for their generous donation to Y4Life, a donation which has helped us expand our ministry to the high school level. The fall was filled with conferences and classroom visits. Y4Life was present at the National LEA Convention and presented at both Beautiful Feet and the Life Symposia at Concordia Portland. These events provided opportunities to dialogue with teachers, college students, and community members about a variety of life issues as well as how to start and maintain Y4Life Teams. Michelle was also able to visit ten Lutheran high schools this fall, many of which now have Y4Life Teams. (See our updated Y4LIFE page for a complete list!) Winter has provided opportunities for writing-check out our new Y4Life brochures!-updating social media platforms (Follow us!), and planning for upcoming events. 
