

Linda Bartlett is the wife of Paul, the mother of two sons and two daughter-in-laws, and the grandmother of six grandchildren. Linda is a homemaker, writer, and speaker. She has been involved in the ministry of Lutherans For Life on the local, state, and national levels. She served on the national board of LFL for 18 years, nine of them as president. In 2004, Linda stepped down from the role of LFL president to start Titus 2 for Life. At retreats, in Bible studies, on radio, and through a website and blog, this ministry uses the model of Titus 2 in mentoring biblical manhood and womanhood (titus2-4life.org and ezerwoman.wordpress.com). Linda is the co-founder of the Lighthouse Center of Hope, a caring pregnancy center in Iowa Falls, Iowa, and serves as president

of its board. Linda is the author of Bible studies, devotionals, and booklets including *Men*, *Women and Relationships*; *Dressing for Life: Secrets of the Great Cover-up*; *Into His Loving Care*; *Not Alone* and more (available through Concordia Publishing House, or www.Titus2-4life.org).



Laura Davis joined the Life Team in June 2012. She is the daughter of a Lutheran pastor and a Lutheran preschool teacher from Katy, Texas. She received a Bachelor of Arts in history from Texas A&M University in 2010 and a Master of Public Service and Administration at A&M's Bush School of Government and Public Service in 2012, with an emphasis on non-profit management. She was a volunteer and sidewalk counselor with the Brazos Valley Coalition for Life and an active member of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League, serving as a Zone Young Women's Representative. She completed an internship at a pregnancy resource center in Lynnwood, Washington, and has previously served on the National Board of Directors for

Lutherans For Life. She currently resides in Arnold, Missouri, where she attends St. John Lutheran Church and is active in the music ministry.



Steve Deace has been described as the Iowa Caucus kingmaker by both Fox News and David Brody at CBN. Though he doesn't fancy himself a kingmaker, Steve Deace is one of the emerging stars in nationally-syndicated talk radio with an uncompromising message based on the Word of God and America's most cherished traditions. A pro-life warrior, Deace has written numerous pro-life articles and commentaries for national publications like *USA Today*, *Townhall*, and *Politico*. Recently named a contributor to the conservative powerhouse *Washington Times*, Deace's show airs in top markets each weeknight like New York, Washington D.C., Houston, Seattle, Philadelphia, and Atlanta. He lives here locally with his wife, Amy, and they've been married for 16 years. They have three children: Ana, Zoe, and Noah.



John Eidsmoe is a retired Air Force Lt. Colonel and Alabama State Defense Force Colonel, Headquarters Judge Advocate, and Deputy Chaplain. He is a Professor of Law at the Oak Brook College of Law and Government Policy, and in his various teaching assignments his students have given him the Outstanding Professor Award or Prof of the Year Award five times. He has served as Senior Staff Attorney at the Alabama Supreme Court and is currently Legal Counsel for the Foundation for Moral Law. He is an ordained pastor with the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations and serves on the Board of Lutherans for Life and on the Board of the Plymouth Rock Foundation, and is a constitutional attorney who has defended home schools, Christian schools,

the right of students to study the Bible in public schools, and the right of public officials to display the Ten Commandments. He has authored 14 books and numerous audio and video lecture series. He holds six academic degrees in law, theology and political science, as well as graduating from the Air Command & Staff College and the Air War College. He is Third Degree Black Belt with the American Taekwondo Foundation, a Fifth Degree Black Belt with the Gospel Martial Arts Union, and a Fifth Degree Black Belt with Black Belts of the Faith International. Colonel Eidsmoe is an avid horseman and skier. He and his wife Marlene have been married since 1970, have three children (David, Kirsten, and Justin), and live in rural Pike Road, Alabama.



Jenny Farrell is a natural communicator and storyteller, with a unique ability to connect with her audience. Drawing from her journey out of fear and anxiety, she offers the hope and healing found in Jesus Christ. She is passionate about seeing people set free, and specializes in women's events and retreats, as well as life-affirming conferences. As a registered nurse performing limited ultrasounds at a local pregnancy center, Jenny shares her insights regarding the pain of abortion. She is also an author and pastor's wife, and currently lives in Iowa.



The Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison was first elected to the office of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod president in 2010 and was re-elected in 2013. Harrison joined the staff at the LCMS International Center in St. Louis in 2001 as the executive director of the church's former World Relief and Human Care ministry. Previously, Harrison served as a pastor at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Westgate, Iowa (1991-1995), and Zion Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, Indiana (1995-2001). Harrison graduated with a bachelor's degree in religious studies from Morningside College in Sioux City, Iowa, in 1984. Following his graduation, he and his wife, Kathy, spent a year as missionaries in a remote Canadian Cree Indian village with the Lutheran

Association of Missionaries and Pilots. Harrison went on to earn a Master of Divinity in 1989 and a Master of Sacred Theology in 1991, both from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne. In 2011, he received two honorary doctorates: a Doctor of Laws from Concordia University, Ann Arbor, Mich., and a Doctor of Divinity from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne. He is a prolific writer whose books include *A Little Book on Joy*, a devotional-style book about finding delight in living a Christ-centered life in today's society, and *Christ Have Mercy: How to Put Your Faith in Action*, a book urging Christians to consider the innumerable opportunities they have

to show mercy to fellow Christians and to anyone God places in their path. Harrison and his wife live in Ballwin, Missouri, and are members of Village Lutheran Church in Ladue, Missouri, where Harrison also serves as assistant pastor. They have two sons. Harrison is an avid banjo player and instrumentalist who makes guitars, banjos, and mandolins.

Chris Lamb is a graduate of DeVry University with a B.S. in Computer Information Systems. Immediately following college, Chris served in the United States Air Force as a Communications Officer at Peterson AFB, Colorado Springs, Colorado. After separating from the USAF, Chris worked as a consultant providing software development and network management training and services in the Kansas City area before serving as the CIO for a "dot com." Chris left the private sector in 2004 to join the FBI as a Special Agent. Chris first served in Springfield, Illinois, working a combination of public corruption and cyber violations before transferring to San Antonio where Chris rejoined his USAF colleagues on a Cyber Joint Task Force. In 2010, Chris, his wife Meridith, and children, Jamie and Zane, returned home to Kansas City where he continues to work cyber violations. While with the Bureau, Chris obtained a Masters in Psychology and is currently writing his dissertation for a PhD in Information Assurance/IT Security.



Rev. Dr. James I. Lamb grew up in the small, southern Minnesota town of Good Thunder. There he married his childhood sweetheart, RoxAnne. The Lambs have been blessed with two sons and two daughters-in-law, a granddaughter, Jamie, and grandsons, Luke, Grant, and Zane. Dr. Lamb and RoxAnne live in State Center, Iowa. Dr. Lamb received a B.A. in Biology from Mankato State University in 1973. In 1975 he enlisted in the USAF and served as an Emergency Medical Technician at the USAF Academy Hospital in Colorado Springs. He entered Concordia Seminary, Saint Louis in 1978, served his vicarage year at St. Paul, Royal Oak, Michigan, and graduated with a Master of Divinity in 1982. In 1994 he received his Doctor of Ministry from

Concordia, Saint Louis. Prior to accepting the position of Executive Director of National Lutherans For Life in April, 1996, Dr. Lamb served as senior pastor at St. Paul, Garner, Iowa, for fourteen years. During this time he also served as Circuit Counselor, member of the board of directors for Lutheran Family Service of Iowa, chairman of the board of directors for a community/school youth program, spiritual advisor for a local Lutherans For Life chapter, and chaplain of the Garner Volunteer Fire Department. He presently serves on the Sanctity of Life Committee for the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod Life Ministries. He is the author of numerous brochures, articles, and essays connecting God's Word of Life to the life issues.



Pastor Doug Merkey graduated with a degree in Marketing from Penn State University in 1989. After several years in the corporate world, he obtained his Master of Divinity from Covenant Theological Seminary in St. Louis in 1999. His awareness of God's love for all human life—born and unborn—came while in seminary. Since then, Doug has worked as the college and career pastor and pastor of the Life Team at Twin Oaks Presbyterian Church. He has served on the board of Thrive, St. Louis, a local organization that helps men and women in crisis pregnancies or who are struggling with having chosen abortion. In

January, 2008, Doug was called by Twin Oaks to launch Churches for Life (www.getintolife.org), an organization that exists to nourish churches as gospel-driven champions of life. Doug counts it his

special joy to help Christians see themselves as those who have been rescued by God's amazing love in Christ, and who respond to that love by living humble, joyful people who likewise look to rescue others.



Rev. Peter Preus was born on August 13, 1955, in Fosston, Minnesota, moving a short time later to St. Louis, Missouri, where his father served as a professor at Concordia Seminary. There he spent his years as a youth. He is the fifth of ten children born to Dr. and Mrs. Robert Preus. Pastor Preus was ordained into the Lutheran ministry in July of 1982, having attended Concordia Theological Seminary. During his third year of seminary training (vicarage), Pastor Preus met Jean Lower, a Lutheran day school teacher whom he married in July of 1981. Pastor Preus and Jean were blessed with six children, before Jean was called to her heavenly home on September 4, 1994, having committed suicide. Pastor Preus remarried in May of 1997 to Julie Lams who also had served as a Lutheran day school teacher. Pastor Preus has

served congregations in Casey, Iowa; Mayville, Wisconsin; and Sanford, Michigan. He has been serving The Lutheran Church of the Triune God in Brooklyn Center, Minnesota, since July of 1999.




