### Hope for Life by LFL President Lynette Auch

**C B** ut in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect ...." (1 Peter 3:15).

Our lives are touched daily by some form of life issue within our small communities, across our nation or throughout the world: sickness, disease, death, abortion, infertility, physician-assisted suicide, euthanasia, homosexuality, biotechnology, suicide, homicide, human trafficking, sale of human body parts, gender confusion, etc., etc.

With this constant bombardment, we may find ourselves in the depths of frustration and despair. Even as Christians we may, at times, wonder if there is any hope.



What is hope? In my research, I found strength and encouragement in this definition of biblical hope: a confident expectation and desire for something good in the future.

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you" (1 Peter 1:3-4 NIV).

"[T]he LORD says—he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: 'Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze" (Isaiah 43:1-2 NIV).

As created, redeemed, and called children of God, we have a living hope, a confident expectation, that as we daily navigate through the swirling waters and the blazing flames of the numerous life issues, God promises to be with us. But, notice that God does not take us around or over our troubles, He takes us through them.

"In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that the proven genuineness of your faith—of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire—may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed" (1 Peter 1:6-7 NIV)

"Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given us" (Romans 5:1-5 NIV).

The refining and suffering process of our faith can be quite unpleasant, and even painful, but it produces the hope, the confident expectation, that God desires to be ours.

This HOPE, this confident expectation, found in God's Word assures us of our eternal salvation through the selfless, loving sacrifice of His only Son, Jesus Christ. This HOPE, this confident expectation, emboldens us to be prepared to make a defense for those who cannot speak for themselves. This HOPE, this confident expectation, empowers us to share this **Hope for Life** to a hopeless people and world! This HOPE, this confident expectation, equips us to be Gospel-motivated voices For Life!

#### 2018 LFL National Conference

#### Word of Hope




Word of Hope Director, Deaconess Chrissie Gillet, is dedicated to the mission of proclaiming "life, peace, marriage, and family promised in Christ's love, forgiveness, and mercy" to anyone

contacting the hotline.

In an effort to reach all who suffer, she implemented the LFL strategic plan to accomplish the following:

- 1. Promoted the **Word of Hope** hotline at 19 presentations, retreats, conferences, conventions, and circuit meetings across the nation
- 2. Engaged the youth through confirmation classes, high-school and college-campus events, and social media
- 3. Supported Life Teams and Life Chapters with information and resources on a variety of life issues
- 4. Utilized phone, email, social media, video communications, and postal mail to provide diaconal care, resources, promotional materials, education, encouragement, updates, and letters of appreciation
- 5. Secured grants from LWML Districts and Foundations totaling \$74,586.58 to fund the Word of Hope hotline expansion
- 6. Expanded the database of referrals to include a variety of pan-Lutheran churches, pregnancy centers, and recognized service agencies for anyone contacting Word of Hope

Averaging approximately 10 contacts a month, the **Word of Hope** hotline expansion is still in the early stages and has a long journey ahead. Goals for 2019 include producing a variety of promotional media for distribution, particularly in funded districts; focused training and close collaboration with other organizations to reach specific populations; and continuing assessment of resources to maximize efforts. 
