Iowa Gov. Signs Bill Banning Abortion at Detection of Preborn’s Heartbeat – On Friday, May 4, 2018, Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds signed an historic bill banning abortions once a preborn child’s heartbeat can be detected, at roughly six weeks. Iowa is now the safest state in the nation for preborn children. Live Action President Lila Rose commented after the bill’s passage: “This law acknowledges the scientific fact that the pro-abortion movement tries desperately to ignore: This is a unique, individual human life in the womb, not a ‘clump of cells,’” Rose said, “and just three weeks after fertilization, the child’s little heart is already beating. It’s time for society and our laws to acknowledge that there are two human beings in a pregnancy, and both deserve protection.” The law does include exceptions for rape and incest. The states of North Dakota and Arkansas passed heartbeat/first-trimester preborn protection bills in previous years, but those bills were blocked by the courts.
