The Canadian Council of Academics is scheduled to report to the government by year's end detailing the community's thoughts on possible expansion of euthanasia to include children (known as "mature minors" under 18 years of age), psychiatric patients, and other patients for whom assisted suicide is currently illegal. Meanwhile, a recently published article in the British Medical Journal's *Med Ethics* by a number of Canadian pediatricians, doctors, administrators, and ethicists proposes a policy in support of child euthanasia.
