



# The ADF Center for Life

Far too often, our culture fails to acknowledge the reality that all human life is sacred. Millions of lives have been lost through abortion on demand, we face a national campaign to legalize doctor-assisted suicide, and the conscience rights of pro-life individuals and organizations are increasingly under siege.

## Objective and Strategies

ADF is committed to protecting and advancing the sanctity of human life. We seek to accomplish this objective through a three-pronged approach: safeguarding the rights of conscience of pro-life individuals and organizations; opposing efforts to legalize euthanasia; and pursuing initiatives directly aimed at limiting or overturning *Roe v. Wade*. To this end, we engage in the following strategies:

### Healthcare Rights of Conscience:

Filing lawsuits on behalf of pro-life medical professionals and organizations so that they will be free to refuse to participate in procedures that take life, such as abortion and assisted suicide.

### Limiting *Roe*:

ADF supports pro-life legislation and is committed to defending such legislation in court.

### Protecting Pregnancy Centers:

In June 2018, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its ruling in *National Institute of Family and Life Advocates v. Becerra*, finding that Americans cannot be compelled by the government to express messages that conflict with their beliefs.

### Protecting Pro-life Counselors:

ADF is committed to overturning Supreme Court precedent that allows jurisdictions to create buffer-zone laws that forbid peaceful pro-life sidewalk counselors from engaging in protected speech outside of abortion facilities.
